### **Exodus 24:12-18** (NRSV)

<sup>12</sup>The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." <sup>13</sup>So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. <sup>14</sup>To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them."

<sup>15</sup>Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. <sup>16</sup>The glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. <sup>17</sup>Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. <sup>18</sup>Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

## Notes, Observations, and Thought Questions:

24.12-18 "The separation between heaven and earth collapses in this passage and in others like it. God's voice and his handiwork enter the world of the ordinary." (Nelson, "Text Studies")

24.12 *the mountain* ie, Mt Sinai (see 24.16)

24.15b-18 "In the Old Testament, what God is in himself is called "holy"; what we see of God is called "glory."" (Klein, "Old Testament Text Studies")

24.16 for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud Cf creation & Sabbath on 7<sup>th</sup> day.

24.16, 17 glory of the Lord . . . the appearance of the glory of the Lord What is the difference between the glory of the Lord and the appearance of it?

24.17 like a devouring fire What makes it seem not like a fire, but like a devouring fire?

24.15 the cloud covered the mountain 24.16 the cloud covered (the mountain)

24.18 Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain
What does it mean for something to be covered by a cloud? For someone to enter or be in a cloud? For something to happen on a mountain? What images or associations do clouds & mountains evoke in you?

24.18 forty days and forty nights, ie, a long time

### 2 Peter 1:16-21 (NRSV)

devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. <sup>17</sup>For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." <sup>18</sup>We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

<sup>19</sup>So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. <sup>20</sup>First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, <sup>21</sup>because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

# Notes, Observations, and Thought Questions:

- 1.16 cleverly devised myths Myths can reveal powerful Truth. Here, the author seems to be pitting "myths" against historical facts. Given that, what is the "mythic" power vs the historical power of the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ? What are the historical and mythic content of this week's transfiguration theme?
- 1.17 he received honor and glory from God... Did Jesus undergo an ontological change at the Transfiguration?
- 1.18 We ourselves . . . le, Peter, James, & John.
- 1.19 a lamp shining in a dark pace, until the day dawns . . . What are the "lamps" and "dark places" in our lives? When does the morning star rise in our hearts?
- 1.20-21 What do these verses say about our interpretation &/o proclamation of Scripture?

### **Matthew 17:1-9** (NRSV)

<sup>17.5</sup>Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. <sup>2</sup>And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. 3Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. <sup>4</sup>Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here: if you wish. I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." 5While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said. "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased: listen to him!" 6When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. <sup>7</sup>But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." 8And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

<sup>9</sup>As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

# Notes, Observations, and Thought Questions:

17.1-9 What's going on here?

17.2 transfigured Greek: metamorphōthē "transformed", "metamorphed" How do your people use "transfigured" in their everyday conversations? © I'm not entirely sure what this word means or that anyone else does either. Help me out here?

17.3 Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah Greek: kai idou ōphthē autois Mōusēs kai Ēlias "and behold was seen by them Moses & Elias". Were Moses & Elijah really there?

17.3 What is the significance of Moses & Elijah? Why not Abraham or David? Perhaps that Moses & Elijah didn't die or died mysterious deaths? Perhaps symbolizing the Law & Prophets? Anything else?

17.4 What is the significance of building three "dwellings" (*skēnas* = "tents"; KJV: "tabernacles")? Is there any Trinitarian significance to *three*?

17.5 a bright cloud overshadowed them Cf Ex 24.15-18.

17.6 *fell to the ground* In fear? To worship? Overwhelmed?

17.7 Jesus came and touched them Touch is powerful in grounding people, bringing them back to the here and now.

17.8 What happened to Moses & Elijah?

17.9 Why the secret? What is the value of knowing / finding out after the resurrection?
